What is expected from inspection?

<u>The Ofsted Good Practice Database</u> aims to show you the best of what the sector has to offer through five very different resources, which can help you improve your own provision by learning from others.

Guidance for providers and Her Majesty's Inspectors can be found in the <u>Handbook for the</u> inspection of further education and skills from September 2009.

Section A looks at 'Outcomes for learners' and shows you how inspectors will evaluate:

- how learners will develop literacy, language and numeracy skills to complete their programmes and progress;
- how learners will progress to further learning and employment.

Section B looks at 'Quality of Provision' and shows how inspectors will evaluate the following:

- how learning and assessment are linked to initial and current assessments;
- how teaching and learning methods inspire and challenge learners;
- how well induction, review and guidance sessions support learners.
